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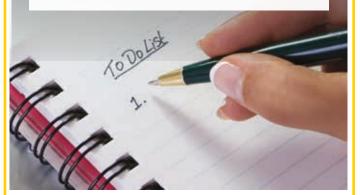


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From Florida

It's the Month of L-O-V-E of which we all express differently. Some like to show their love with gifts, while others prefer more sentimental thoughts like a handwritten card or a properly drafted estate plan.

The current state of affairs reminds all of us that we live in a time of uncertainty. Now, more than ever, we suggest reviewing your estate plan to ensure your assets are protected in the case you pass away unexpectedly.

- The Federal Estate Tax Exemption has increased to \$12,060,000 per person (\$24,120,000 for married couples) through 2025. In 2026, it is set to sunset back to the 2011 exemption, \$5,000,000, indexed for inflation (\$6,600,000 at 2% inflation).
- The annual gift tax exclusion also increased to \$16,000 per person. This allows you to gift \$16,000 to any non-spouse individual without filing a gift tax return.

If you're an Illinois resident, the Illinois State Estate Tax Exemption remains at \$4,000,000 per person and cannot be shared with your spouse.

For example, let's assume John has an IRA worth \$1,500,000, personally owned life insurance with a death benefit of \$2,000,000 (payable to his kids), and an investment account worth \$1,000,000. Without proper estate planning, John would not owe any Federal Estate Tax, but would owe Illinois State Estate Tax on the amount in his name that exceeds \$4,000,000. In John's case, proper estate planning could save his heirs nearly \$80,000 in taxes.

For those yet to look at their Estate Plan, what better time to do it than now? Here are some things to look out for:

- **Guardianship** If you have children under 18, who would care for them if you passed away? Without a Will, the courts would determine their guardian. This may or not be the person(s) you want caring for your children and their finances.
- Asset Distribution How do you want your assets distributed
 if you were to pass away? Under Illinois Intestate Law, your children would inherit half of your assets, and your spouse would
 inherit the other half, unless you had a will in place, held assets
 in trust/joint name, or had a beneficiary listed on the account.
- Powers of Attorney Assuming you were incapacitated, who would step in to manage your finances and make healthcare decisions?
- If you have children over the age of 18, it also makes sense to have them name you as their power of attorney to make any major medical decisions.

• Avoid Probate – transferring assets to a Revocable Living
Trust can help you avoid probate court costs associated with
settling one's estate. Additionally, a Trust allows you to designate a successor trustee to manage the assets within your own
parameters when you are no longer able to do it yourself.

Regardless of how you like to express your love, an organized financial plan and review of your estate plan is a great way to show your family how much you care for them. Consider reviewing this with your Financial Advisor on an annual basis to help secure a prosperous future for your loved ones.

But if you want something that will actually take you places you never thought a 4-wheel *vehicle could go – then get your name on the waiting list;* Ford has built something really special for those who enjoy going off-road and getting away from it all.

Available as a two or four-door, the 2022 Ford Bronco is built for serious off-roading. The entire roof can be removed, as well as all the doors. Gone is all the unnecessary clutter, like sound-deadening material, swanky leather, or cushy suspension. The body-on-frame Bronco is raw, loud, and bouncy - but take it offroad, and immediately it all makes sense. It's a compromise – you can either have the on-road niceties, or the off-road capability. Ford obviously chose the latter.

Additionally, for buyers who truly want the ultimate in off-roading, there's an available add-on "sasquatch" package with 17-inch beadlock wheels wrapped in 35-inch mud tires and heavyduty Bilstein shock.

Power to the 2022 Ford Bronco comes from either a 2.3L turbo 4-cylinder engine making 300hp and 325 lb-ft torque or an optional 2.7L twin-turbo V6 making 330hp and 415 lb-ft torque. The standard transmission is a 10-speed automatic, with an optional 7-speed manual, whereas the seventh gear is actually a slow-speed "crawler" gear intended for off-roading only. Unfortunately, buyers who opt for the manual can only have the 2.3L engine and have to forgo the "sasquatch" package, as well as the "trail turn assist" feature.

So, what was the two-door Bronco like to drive? Well, having driven

the four-door version a few months prior, there's a noticeable difference in the ride. The shorter wheelbase of the two-door makes the drive bouncier, which is only further amplified by the extra-large tires of the "sasquatch" package on my test vehicle. Although the two-door also has less cargo space and only seats four, it is lighter and easier to maneuver, making it a little better suited for off-roading than its bigger, fourdoor brother. The car's interior isn't bad, but it's not great either - panels flex when you push on them and there's a lot of hard plastic. However, the controls are nicely placed with real buttons and dials for the radio, volume, and temperature settings. Having a conversation at speeds over 70mph can be difficult as tire and wind noise really start to overwhelm the cabin. On the plus side, both engine options feel strong and capable, though the 2.7L V6 delivers effortless power at highway speeds and does 0-60mph in an impressive

Prices for the Bronco are truly all over the place. The Base version two-doors starts at a reasonable \$29,995 but add more options and features, and the price starts to climb quickly: A Black Diamond model will set you back \$37,545, with the Outer Banks version hitting \$40,450. The top-tier Wildtrak starts at \$52,065 and can reach North of \$56,000 with options, making the pricing span between the lowest and highest Bronco at over \$26,000 - that is a huge price swing.

Overall, the new Bronco is great at what it is intended to do, to get off the pavement and head down the beaten path. With all of the onboard technology and different drive-modes, the Bronco makes the hard stuff look easy - no matter what your off-roading skill level is, this new 4x4 will make you look like a serious off-roading pro!

CHERRY SQUARES

A SWEET AND SIMPLE TREAT!









Here is a recipe that you will make over and over again. Everyone loves it. I had a workman here one year while I was making it for Christmas and then again for Valentine's Day. He asked me to teach him how to make it. He has since returned to tell me how often this recipe is requested by his family. If you're lucky enough to have a man like that in your life, he'll appreciate this easy recipe that looks more difficult than it is ... so he can reap the compliments.

A little background about the recipe: Many years ago (over 50) when I would cart my daughters to the Park District in Chicago for playtime activities, the moms would gather in another room and talk about all sorts of things - including recipes. We would bring our favorites and have a paper and pen ready. This one comes from a butter company and only has six ingredients, including the cherries. The dough almost tastes like pound cake with sunken cherries in the center. I hope you think it's easy and is as good as it looks.

Easy Cherry Squares

- 1½ c. sugar
- 1 c. Butter (2 sticks = 1/2 lb.)
- · 4 large eggs
- 2 c. flour (sifted)
- 1 T. lemon juice or extract
- · 1 can cherry pie filling (Aldi's has the best)
- · Cream the butter and sugar at medium speed until light & fluffy.
- · Add eggs one at a time beating after each egg.
- · Gradually add flour and then lemon juice/extract.

- Pour batter into Pam sprayed 15x10x1' jelly roll pan.
- · Mark off with the edge of a spatula into small 6x9 or 8x4 squares.
- · Place two small cherries into the center of each square for the mini size or three cherries for the larger size.

Bake at 350* for 45 minutes. When warm and not completely cooled, sift or shake confectioners sugar over the entire pan of squares.

Cool completely and then cut into squares.

Now wasn't that easy? I hope so.

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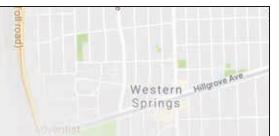
